A true and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods chattells debts and rights of Mary Porter late of Chelsworth in the County of Suff Spinster deceased made viewed valued and appraised the twelfth day of April in the one and twentieth yeere of the Reigne of our Sovereigne Lord Charles the Second by the grace of God now King over England &c Anno Domini 1669 by John Clover and James Andrews of Chelsworth aforesaid as followeth
